... even if they need to social distance inside their classrooms or transition to teaching online.



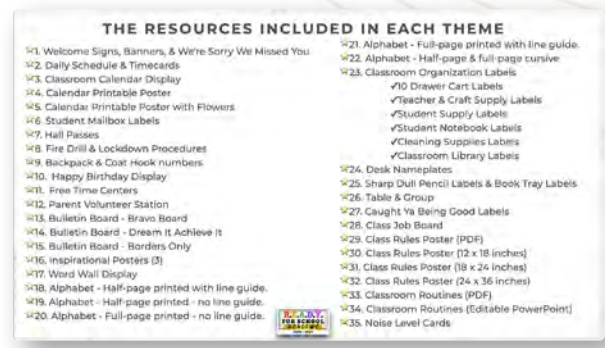

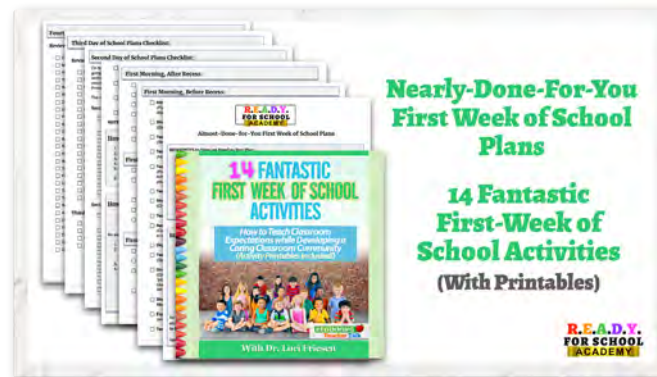

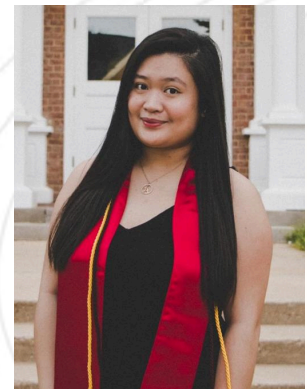

WHO IS DR. LORI FRIESEN?

Dr. Lori Friesen is the creator of the R.E.A.D.Y. for School Academy and host of the popular Beginning Teacher Talk Podcast with more than 60,000 downloads in 7 countries. Lori taught elementary school for 10 years in Canada, and also taught in Hong Kong and Japan before completing her Master's in Education focused on understanding the struggles of new elementary teachers. Dr. Lori presented her research in support of new teachers at more than two dozen teacher conferences across Canada, selling thousands of copies of her book, *The Beginning Teacher's Handbook for Elementary School* (2008).

After completing her M.Ed., Lori taught pre-service educators at the University of Lethbridge and supervised 150 students at various stages of their student teaching placements before completing her PhD in Education at the University of Alberta in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada.

Dr. Lori has been inducted into the Golden Key International Honor Society in recognition of her outstanding academic achievement and excellence. Her doctoral research was awarded a SSHRC (Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada) Doctoral Fellowship, the Isaak Walton Killam Memorial Scholarship, the University of Alberta Doctoral Prize of Distinction, the Alberta Teachers' Association Doctoral Fellowship, and the University of Alberta Ph.D. Recruitment Scholarship.

Her work has been published in various peer-reviewed journals, including *Early Childhood Education*, *Learning Landscapes*, *Language & Literacy*, *Childhood Education International*, and most recently in *The International Journal of Learning*. She has also published articles in many trade magazines, including *The Alberta Teacher's Association*, and her work has recently been featured as the cover story for *The Latham Letter*. Lori's M.Ed. work has also been published as a book, *The Beginning Teacher's Handbook for Elementary School* (2008).
